a. Describe the method(s) you used.

b. Results: What did you learn?

The implementation of a new curriculum presented many learning opportunities for the Nursing Program. Students demonstrated difficulty with transitioning from a single course in fall term to three courses in winter and spring. This was the first year of implementation of the OCNE curriculum and the first time we have used a letter grading scheme. We uncovered a greater need to provide points for paperwork and projects that was not apparent in a P/NP system. We also realized the students were having difficulty with multiple tests being required in a weeks' time, as well as a summary test and cumulative final test being given with little time between for remediation. Additionally this cohort of students did not have the benefit of other second year students to connect with and learn from, they expressed their feeling like they did not have anyone to commiserate with.

3. Identify any changes that should, as a result of this assessment, be implemented towards improving students' attainment of outcomes.

Areas that the nursing program felt needed to be addressed after assessment of student achievement of outcomes in the first year of OCNE implementation, as identified in the Program Review, April 2011, were:

- The grading scheme of the nursing courses changed from P/NP to a letter grade scale with the
 implementation of OCNE. The SAC will revisit the level of point structure for the course grades
 as well as points for course work requirements such as papers and projects to provide credit
 for work done.
- Sequencing of testing will be done that will provide time between exams of concurrent courses as well as between a summary exam and a final exam. This will give students opportunity for remediation and to seek and receive faculty assistance.
- In order to address the barriers to completion, it is recommended that the Student Mentor program be reinstituted and follow through on assessing for student language strengths at pre-admission. Early communication and orientation for students will help connect students the program and services early.
