Anthropological SAC Learning Assessment Plan 2010-2011

- During Winter and Spring term, professors will survey students regarding learning two core outcomes (communication and cultural awareness) using a student survey form developed by the SAC.
- During Winter and Spring term, professors will collect work from two ANT 103 classes focused on the same core outcomes. The rubric for analyzing this work was developed during the Fall Oct 27th SAC meeting.
- During Spring term, professors will analyze and summarize the data collected and determine whether changes need to be made.

Results of the Assessment

Based on the assessments conducted by faculty in two cultural anthropology classes, the data suggests that the majority of students had a good grasp of oral and written communication skills. Students also demonstrated a good understanding of cultural awareness and ethnocentrism, and they were also able to use the concept of culture to evaluate human behavior. Average student scores ranged from 2.8 to 2.6 in the areas assessed, indicating that most students were meeting the core outcome requirements. These results mirrored similar data on the student survey form that the SAC also collected. Most students surveyed reported that their experience in the ANT 103 classes had increased their communication skills and level of cultural awareness.

The results indicate that the anthropology program is doing a good job fostering communication and cultural awareness skills in students.
