
# PCC Education Abroad First Steps Videos:

# **Application Process + Timeline**

### **Application & Preparation: A**




Let's take a look at the overall timeline you can expect as you prepare to study abroad.




Understand all of your study abroad options by reviewing our website CLICK. Once you know which program is best for you, you will fill out an online application CLICK. This won't take too long and is free. Take a look at the How to Apply webpage on our website for additional information (CLICK).

Consider meeting with an Academic Advisor to understand how this course fits into your overall academic plan and make sure you are progressing academically to stay on track at PCC.

You also want to have a full understanding of the costs associated with studying abroad, and create a plan to pay for the program. If you receive Flnancial Aid, meet with a Financial Aid Advisor early to look at how your specific financial aid package can help with costs. 
All PCC study abroad programs require participants to have a valid passport. The best time to apply for or renew your passport is early, ideally at the same time as you apply for your study abroad program. Passport processing times can take up to three months, so we strongly encourage students to apply for or renew their passport by March 1.



After you apply for your study abroad program of choice and you are admitted by our office, you will receive an email notification with your next steps.

These steps including attending a Financial Planning meeting, applying for scholarships, and understanding how and when to pay the non-refundable deposit to save your spot on the program.

### **Application & Preparation: A**




After you pay your non-refundable deposit (which is due February 22) you will continue to prepare to study abroad. This will include pre-departure orientation meetings and getting to know your cohort during the late winter and spring terms. Finally, after your preparation, you will depart for your program during the summer.




Our office is here to help you through this process, step by step.
