Our office works closely with students as they apply and prepare to study abroad. The next few videos help explain how our processes work and what to expect as you apply to study abroad with PCC.

Eligibility Requirements

- 18 years or older (upon departure)
- Good academic and disciplinary standing
- Prerequisite course(s) completed or waived
- Attend an Education Abroad First Steps Meeting
- Independence, self-reliance, and maturity
- Willingness and ability to embrace the challenges of studying abroad.



In order to be eligible to participate on a PCC program, you need to be 18 years or older, in good academic standing, and have completed the course prerequisites. You will need to follow our process and timeline which shows that you are independent and mature and you are willing to embrace challenges (and fun) of traveling.
