Books

Printed books, one author

Format:

Author. Title. Edition statement if not the first edition. City of publication: Publisher, Publication year. Medium.

Example:

Kettlewell, Caroline. Electric Dreams: One Unlikely Team of Kids and the Race to Build the Car of the Future.

New York: Carol & Graf, 2004. Print.

Printed books, 2 or 3 authors [4+ authors, use et al. after the first author's name]

Format:

Author, Author, and Author. *Title*. Edition statement if not the first edition. City of publication: Publisher, Publication year. Medium.

Example:

Byatt, Andrew, Alastair Forthergill, and Martha Holmes. The Blue Planet: A Natural History of the Oceans.

New York: DK, 2001. Print.

Printed books, one editor [multiple editors follow the same form as authors]

Format:

Editor, ed. Title. Edition statement if not the first edition. City of publication: Publisher, Publication Year.

Medium.

Example:

Haerens, Margaret, ed. Illegal Immigration. Detroit: Greenhaven, 2006. Print.

Electronic books, one author

Format:

Author. Title. Edition statement if not the first edition. City of publication: Publisher, Publication year.

Database name. Medium. Date of access.

Example:

Junker, Karan. *Gardening with Woodland Plants*. 2nd ed. Portland: Timberland, 2007. *NetLibrary*. Web. 5 June 2008.

Journal and Magazine Articles

Electronic journal and magazine articles from a subscription database

Format:

Author. "Article title." *Title of publication* EITHER volume.issue (Publication year) OR day month year: Page range, starting page with hyphen, OR total pages. *Database name*. Medium. Date of access.

Example:

Farr, Thomas. "Diplomacy in an Age of Faith." Foreign Affairs 87.2 (2008): 110-24. Academic Search Premier. Web. 4 Aug. 2008.

Electronic journal and magazine articles from the Internet

Format:

Author (if any). "Article Title." *Title of online publication* EITHER volume.issue (Publication year) OR day month year: Page range, starting page with hyphen, OR total pages. Medium. Date of access.

Example:

Ross, Alex. "Song of the Earth: A Composer Takes Inspiration from the Arctic." *New Yorker* 12 May 2008: 5. Web. 1 Sept. 2008.

Printed journal articles with a volume number and no issue number

Format:

Author. "Article title." Title of publication Volume (Publication year): page-page. Medium.

Example:

Friedman, Warren. "Volunteerism and the Decline of Violent Crime." Journal of Criminal Law and

Criminology 88 (1998): 1453-1474. Print.

Printed journal articles with volume and issue numbers

Format:

Author. "Article title." Title of publication Volume.issue (Publication year): page-page. Medium.

Example:

Napoli, Philip. "Deconstructing the Diversity Principle." Journal of Communication 49.4 (1999): 7-34. Print.

Printed magazine articles with a date and no volume or issue numbers

Format:

Author. "Article title." Title of publication Date of issue: page-page. Medium.

Example:

Griffin, Katherine. "Rebel Against a Sedentary Life." *Health* Apr. 1999: 82-8. Print.

Newspaper Articles

Electronic newspaper articles from a subscription database

Format:

Author (if any). "Article title." *Title of newspaper* Publication day month year: Page range, starting page with hyphen, OR total pages. *Database name*. Medium. Date of access.

Example:

Tansey, Bernadette. "Sports Doping Detection a Never-Ending Science." *San Francisco Chronicle* 11 Aug. 2008: A1. *Proquest Newspapers*. Web. 15 Aug. 2008.

Printed newspaper articles

Format:

Author (if any). "Article title." Title of newspaper Date of issue, edition (if any): page-page. Medium.

Example:

Rosenbloom, Stephanie. "Giant Retailers Look to Sun for Energy Savings." *New York Times* 10 Aug. 2008: B1.

Print.

Encyclopedia and Dictionary Articles

Electronic encyclopedia and dictionary articles

Format:

Author (if any). "Article title." *Title of publication*. Editor (if any). Version number (if any). Date of electronic publication or last update. *Database name*. Medium. Date of access.

Examples:

Rushton, Julian. "Mozart, Wolfgang Amadeus." *New Grove Dictionary of Opera*. Ed. Stanley Sadie. 2008. *Oxford Music Online*. Web. 1 Sept. 2008.

"Columbia River." Encyclopaedia Britannica Online. 2008. Web. 30 July 2008.

Printed encyclopedia articles, signed and unsigned

Format:

Author (if any). "Title of article." *Title of encyclopedia*. City of publication: Publisher, Publication year.

Medium.

Examples:

Iverson, Peter. "Navajo." Encyclopedia Americana. International ed. Danbury: Scholastic Library, 2004. Print.

"Jackson Pollack." The New Encyclopaedia Britannica. Chicago: Encyclopaedia Britannica, 2007. Print.

Web Sources

Web sites

Format:

Author (if any). *Title of entire Web site*. Editor (if any). Version number (if any). Publishing institution or organization, Date of page OR last update. Medium. Date of access. <complete URL if page cannot be accessed using a search engine>.

Examples:

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. USA.gov, 30 Mar. 2009. Web. 1 Apr. 2009.

The Perseus Digital Library. Ed. Gregory Crane. Tufts U, n.d. Web. 1 May 2008.

Web pages

Format:

Author (if any). "Title of Web page." Editor (if any). Version number (if any). Title of entire Web site.

Publishing institution or organization, Date of page OR last update. Medium. Date of access. <complete URL if page cannot be accessed using a search engine>.

Examples:

"America on the Move." Smithsonian National Museum of American History. Smithsonian Institution, 2008.

Web. 1 June 2008. http://americanhistory.si.edu/onthemove/index.html>.

Fung, Karen. "Africa: South of the Sahara." *Stanford University Libraries*. Leland Stanford U, 2008. Web. 3 Apr. 2008. http://www-sul.stanford.edu/depts/ssrg/africa/.
