# Early Metal Furniture

- First modern metal furniture produced by Karl Friedrich Schinkel in 1820
- By the 1930's cast iron furniture gained popularity due to ease of production and appreciation within the market
- Cast Iron continued to gain popularity within the Art Nouveau movement



# Modern Metal Furniture

- Tubular steel gained popularity in the 1920's, utilizing developments in welding and steel manufacturing.
- The Wassily Chair, designed by Marcel Breuer is said to be the first using this method
- This kind of tubular steel design was embraced and deeply explored within 3 major modern design movements
  - Art Deco (1910-1940)
  - Bauhaus (1920-1934)

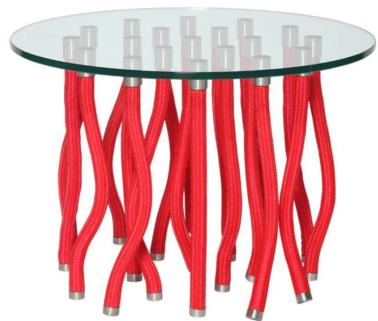

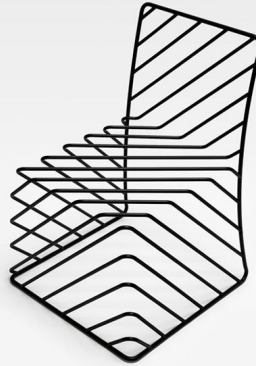
