- ☐ Check that everything was received and that you are on track. Check your application status frequently.
- ☐ After you receive acceptance letters, financial aid and/or scholarship offers, make the final decision where you will attend, and accept your offer.
- ☐ Graduate from PCC! Yay! Send all final transcripts to your new university after your final grades are posted.
- ☐ Attend any orientations and complete ALL necessary enrollment requirements for your new university.
